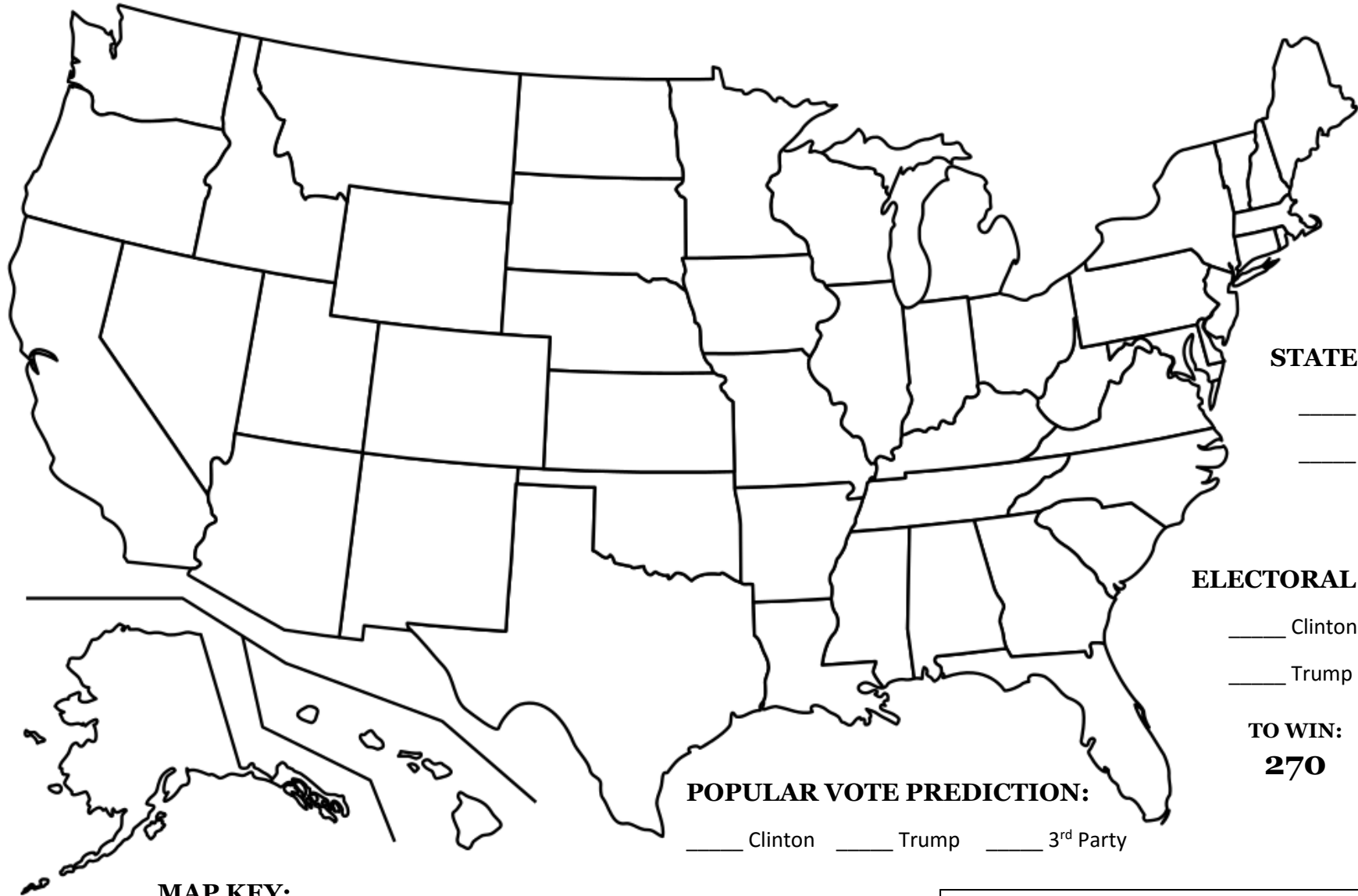

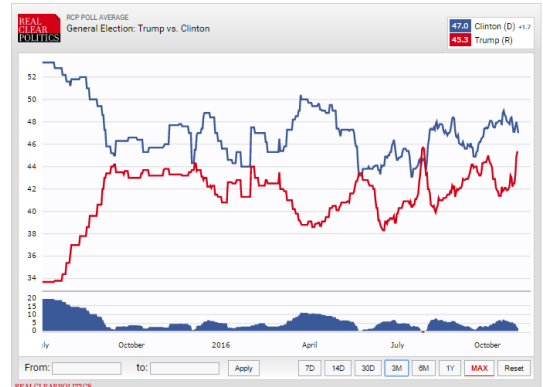

Through Wednesday, 11/2



After a rough month of October, Trump appears to be gaining momentum the week before the election.

Clinton's numbers have stayed relatively steady over the past month.

QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER:

1. Who will get the last-minute undecided voters?
2. What news stories may influence public opinion between now and Election Day?
3. Will Trump's momentum continue through Election Day or will it be halted or broken before then?
4. Do you believe that the polls are accurate or will surprise turnout give a candidate a surprise showing?
5. What percentage of the electorate will vote third party (1.7% in 2012) and which candidate will "lose" more votes from this?
