

Rescuers and Resistance iMovie

In groups of 2 you will create a movie trailer in iMovie. If you feel that you will have more success working individually you may do that as well. This trailer will focus on an instance of resistance or rescuers during the Holocaust. This is an opportunity to celebrate and appreciate the sacrifices that were made in the face of such horror. It brings us back to this question "what would you do"?

Since the purpose of the trailer is to attract an audience to the film, these excerpts are usually drawn from the most exciting, funny, or otherwise noteworthy parts of the film.

In your groups you will have one master iPad that the movie will be created on. Each person will collect photos and video for the project and write their captions. Both photos and video will be airdropped onto the master iPad. You can then either have just one person create the movie, or rotate the master iPad around and each person inserts their own information.


When choosing the trailer be careful that it is appropriate to the topic. No happy go lucky theme for a serious subject....it does not make sense! Take some time with your partner to listen to a few trailers to decide what one you want to use. I have three suggestions for you:

Resistance Movements:

the April 1943 **Warsaw Ghetto** uprising

the August 1943 revolt at the **Treblinka** death camp

the October 1943 break out at the **Sobibor** death camp

the October 1944 bombing of a crematorium at the **Auschwitz** death camp

The Bielski Brothers working in a partisan group in the woods of Poland (now Belarus)

Irene Gut Opdyke – In My Hands

Chiune Sugihara – Visas for Life

Raoul Wallenberg – Saving the Hungarian Jews

Andre and Magda Trocme – Village of Le-Chambon-sur-Lignon

Irena Sendler – Smuggled 2500 Jewish children out of the Warsaw Ghetto

The Rescue in Denmark – Danish resistance save as many Jews as they can

Miep Gies – Risked her life to hide the family of Anne Frank
